This ride was mainly so great because of the fantastic landscape. When we came there, we rowed with a little ship on a wonderful lake. But

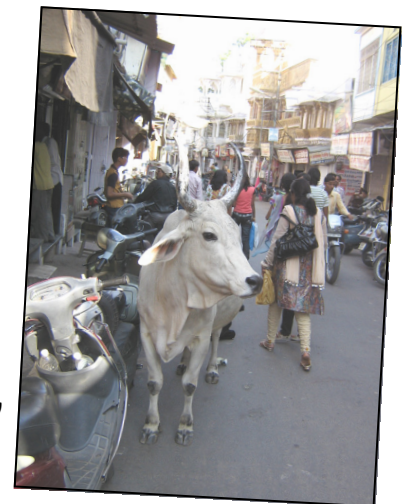
this wasn't the only thing we did there. The fish museum

and the temple had also been very great .

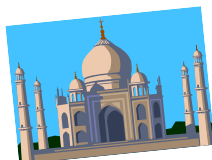
After all these exciting events, we went home. On the way

Seeding Modern Public School

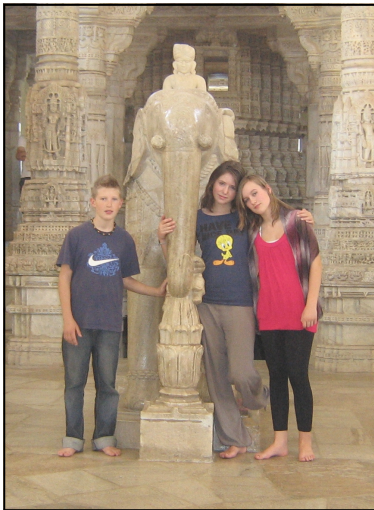

Thank you very much for your hospitality and for all the thing we have learned.

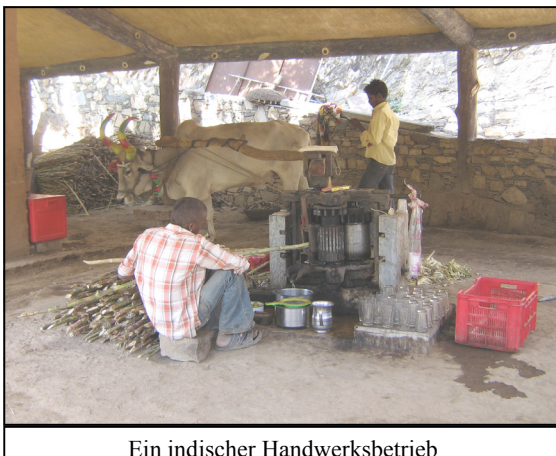

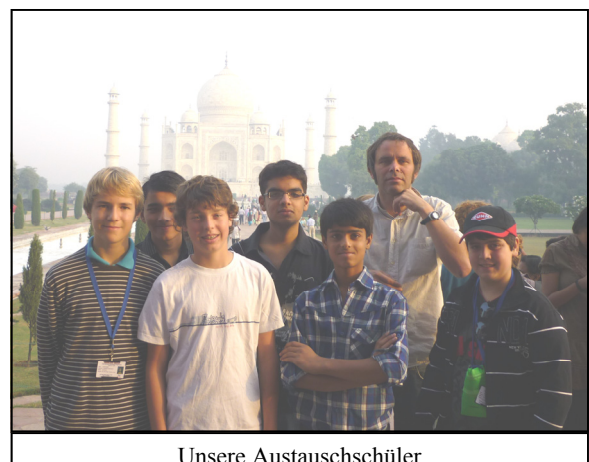
